She was a certified Lay Minister of the Lutheran (ELCA) Church,

served on her church council, and chaired numerous committees. Even after Margie's daughters were raised, she remained active in the Girl Scouts of America in Pittsburgh, serving on the council and local levels as a troop leader, cookie chair, neighborhood manager and camp trainer/counselor.

Since living in Florida, Margie has volunteered her time to the AARP as a trainer and instructor for their Defensive Driving Program and to the Girl Scouts. Her spare time is currently filled by volunteering with the Gulfcoast Humane Society, the Big Brothers/Big Sisters Reading Program, and as treasurer of the Redeemer Lutheran Church Ladies Guild, as well as serving on other church committees.

Margie is a Paul Harris Major Donor and a charter member of the Paul Harris Society.
